## Instructions for Use

- 1 At the conclusion of the four-phase test, review the participant's recorded impressions against the practitioner's actual chip selections.
- 2 Count the number of correct impressions across the four phases.
- 3 Refer to the classification scale on the document:
- 1 Correct = Baseline (No Action)
- 2 Correct = Potential Receptor (Monitor)
- 3 Correct = High Perceptibility (Recommend Follow-Up)
- 4 Correct = Subject of Interest (Further Scrutiny)
- 4 Verbally inform the participant of their classification if appropriate to the testing context.
- 5 Record the classification in the participant's observation file.
- 6 For "Subject of Interest" classifications, notify your immediate supervisor for guidance on next steps.

## Optional Closing Statement

If conditions allow, you may use the provided statement for closure with the participant:

"Under Stargate protocols, your results would determine if you were flagged for further testing. Based on today's session, your classification is: [state classification]. Thank you for participating in this classified simulation."

## Operational Note

Maintain a calm, objective demeanour throughout to preserve protocol integrity.

Adjust pacing based on the participant's comfort and mental readiness.

Optional: Have the participant sign and date their observation log for formal file closure.

If using in a civilian testing scenario, conclude with a brief reveal of the practitioner's chosen chip colour to reinforce credibility and the participant's perceived alignment.
